

Brenthia pavonacella is the only representative of the genus in North America.

The adults are diurnal, seldom fly, & more often are seen walking. The larvae feed on the underside of the leaflets of woodland Desmodium spp. & have the unusual habit of cutting a small "escape portal" hole through the host leaf. If disturbed, the larva very quickly disappears through the hole to the opposite side of the leaf.
