Virtually no beetles; no saturnids, no zales, no sphinx moths, and the only underwing I saw flew by about 10 feet from the sheet (at 8:59 p.m.) with his afterburners on. A tattered Red Admiral came to the sheet, and stayed for the duration. When I turned out the light, there were about 70 moths on the sheet, including a number of Orange Wings, Buttercup moths, and 3-Spotted Philips.
